Comité Noviembre Scholarship Program

For the past 37 years, CN has developed programs geared to the support of educational opportunities and leadership development for Puerto Rican and Hispanic youth. These programs are firmly rooted in the belief that, in order to succeed in life, you must pursue a higher education, give back to your community through volunteer efforts and know your cultural roots. Each one of our over 390 scholars are making an impact in the communities in which they live.

Current Scholarship Descriptions

Comité Noviembre Scholarship for Volunteerism: Since its inception, Comité Noviembre has placed special focus on volunteerism and educational excellence as the key to the future of the Puerto Rican community. In November of 1996, in celebration of the tenth anniversary of Puerto Rican Heritage Month, the Comité Noviembre Scholarship Awards Program was established. Comité Noviembre scholarships to exceptional Puerto Rican youth who are making a difference in their community through their volunteer efforts.

Richie Perez Scholarship for Peace & Justice: In 2004, the Puerto Rican community lost an advocate, community leader and urban warrior. Richie Pérez was an activist and leader in the fight for social justice and human rights. Richie believed greatly in the power and potential of young people to create social change. In his memory, Comité Noviembre established the Richie Pérez Scholarship for Peace & Justice to recognize Puerto Rican young people for their commitment, activism, and achievements in the areas of human rights and social justice.

The Ernesto Malave Scholarship for the Arts: Ernesto Malave was the Vice Chancellor for Budget and Finance at The City University of New York. he passed away unexpectedly in 2009.

Mr. Malave was instrumental in making the Annual Comité Noviembre Artisans Fair a reality by providing funding and resources. To commemorate the 10th anniversary of the Fair, CN established the Ernesto Malave Scholarship for the Arts. The award recognizes Puerto Rican students pursuing higher education majoring in the Arts. This annual award will both promote the advancement of new artists and invest in their continued growth by providing support for their ongoing education and artistic development.

The Josefina Aguado Scholarship for Single Parents is awarded to single parents pursuing a college or a graduate degree. This scholarship is made possible by a generous donation from the husband-and-wife philanthropist team of Bill Aguado and Kathi Pavlick. This is the fourth year of their five-year two-scholarship commitment. The scholarship is named in honor of Mr. Aguado's mother to recognize the sacrifices single parents make on behalf of their families.

The Dr. Evelina Antonetty Scholarship for Community Activism is awarded to a young person age 17 to 25, that has volunteered, advocated or has taken action to affect change in the Puerto Rican/Hispanic community for more than five years consecutively in the areas of civic, educational, humanitarian or social justice issues, Evelina Antonetty was a labor organizer, meticulous strategist, master diplomat and tactician who could analyze any situation and move people thoughtfully and spiritually, charismatic advocate of bilingual education and parents' rights, and a mentor to a cadre of young people who would impact New York in the arts, politics, and social service.

The Nolda Vivó Scholarship is awarded to low-income students pursuing a degree related to bilingual education. Recipient must be committed to advancing the educational attainment of K-12 grade students from low socio-economic backgrounds through humanizing and transformative educational approaches.

Comité Noviembre Scholarship Selection Committee

Over the years, CN has selected leaders from various sectors of the community who have demonstrated interest in the educational excellence and leadership development of our youth to serve on the selection committee. The scholarship selection committee is headed by Lisa M. Rodriguez, MSW, education and youth advocate, and Elba Cabrera, community leader who jointly co-chair the committee, Zenaida Muslin, Retired Diversity Coordinator Founder & Leader of Latino Educators in NY Schools, and Sandy Figueroa, Business Professor at Hostos Community College, now retired. All serve on a volunteer basis.

Selection Process

The selection process is competitive and documented community service is key to be selected for all scholarship programs.

To be eligible to receive any of the CN scholarships:

- Applicants must be of Puerto Rican descent.
- Applicants must have a minimum of one-year of volunteer community service experience.
- Applicants must be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate degree program in an accredited college or university upon receipt of the award for the Fall of that year.
- Applicants must have a minimum Grade Point Average (G.P.A.) of 3.0 or better.
- Applicants must undergo a virtual interview with the Selection Committee (in English or Spanish).
- Applicants must be between the ages of 17 and 25.
- Applicants cannot be a former CN scholarship awardee of any CN Scholarships.

A completed application package must include:

- An application form
- Essay
- A biographical sketch
- Volunteer community service statement
- One letter of recommendation
- Academic transcripts (for College Students)
- High School transcript (for High School Students)
- Headshot photo

The letter of recommendation should be requested from teachers, counselors, mentors, clergy, community leaders, etc. The letters should highlight the applicant's volunteer community service, how long has the person known the candidate, and the specific contributions the applicant has made to the community. The letter of recommendation must be written on organizational letterhead with a contact phone number of the person writing the recommendation letter.
